Hey, guess what? A few billion years ago everything magically became perfectly in sync, everything was in one place... And then boom! The universe was created. Then after a billion years or so of being nothing but boogers and snot, you probably grew legs or something and eventually made it out of your slime bucket. Eventually you became a monkey and spent the next hundred thousand years eating bugs off of your butt!

Sounds attractive huh?

Creation and Evolution aren't mere trivial theological concepts that we *don't have to agree on*. They aren't merely something that each individual decides on for himself. They are the raw truth on which every belief you will ever have is founded. Yeah that's right... It all starts with Creation.

You're given two options. One, you descended from boogers and monkeys over billions of years because of raw chance. Genesis 1:1-3;31;2:1-3

[1] In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. [2] Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. [3] And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. [31] God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. And there was evening, and there was morning--the sixth day. [1] Thus the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array. [2] By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. [3] And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done.

"God said..." That's powerful stuff. God gives us commands that we are to live out in our every day lives. The first command God gave us was "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air and over every living creature that moves on the ground." (Gen 1:28) God continued to give us commands all the way through the Old Testament and through the New Testament. God even gives you commands now, every day of your life.

God commands you to repent, to do good works, and to love. God commands you to do a lot. He always commands you to do good things, though. God is the one person that stands true all the time, no matter what. He's the best friend you could ever have.

When you have a best friend, what do you usually want to do? You want to do whatever you can, help them out whenever you can and be the best friend for them, that you can be. Why should it be any different with God? Why should you treat that best friend any different?

God stands true forever, unlike that best friend from first grade who moved to Idaho and who you never see anymore.

So, Johnny, your best friend freshman year asks you and your girlfriend to double date with him and his dream girl. He offers a command for you. What do you do? "Oh, no Johnny, can't sorry, don't want to." No, you say "Sure, Saturday ok?" So when God commands "Have faith in me and get eternal life." What do you say?

Unlike Johnny, God's command has a reward at the end. What do you get out of helping out Johnny? 12 bucks out of your pocket from the theatre and gum stuck to the back of your pants from the dork that sat there before you. By listening to God, you get eternal life. That's cool.

We see that God commanded the whole world to be made. What are you going to say? If you totally rely, and are absolutely dependent on God, trusting in him and only him, I can pretty much guess what you are going to say. "Of course God made the whole world!"

Believing in Creation is a trust thing. If you trust in God, you trust you're going to heaven, and you trust **everything** that he says.

Have you ever read the book of Genesis? Have you ever read the first three chapters of Genesis? Would you believe that 9 out of 10 people you pick at random have never even read the first chapter of Genesis in it's entirety! It's not that long of a book.

As you go through your week, think of all the things God commands you to do. Think of all the things God says to you, and all the things he wants you to do. Try answering God's command. The more you trust, the happier you'll be. I guarantee!
