The Bible: Two Verses a <u>Day</u>, Will keep the **Devil** Away

Daily Application from the Big Cheese

In the last issue we talked about what the Bible is - how it is inerrant, infallible, and perfect because it is from God. Now it's time to use that perfect Book that has been given to us. God didn't have His servants write the Bible just for fun. Rather, He had a plan that went along with it. As Christians, we are supposed to use the Bible to guide us through everything we do every day of our lives.

God, the Big Cheese, has written up a tutorial - Christian Living 101 - however, you won't find this course taught in any public school or in any major university. You can only find this class in that big old dust bunny collection underneath your bed. The Big Cheese's tutorial, manual, help file is available for study every single day. In this issue we're going to talk about taking what you learn every Sunday and applying it to your every day lives. Often we talk about the Christian life in this newsletter; well this is another one of those issues because the Bible is our guide to that life.

Back to the Basics...

How does all the stuff in the Big Book apply to us today? What does it mean to us in 2002? Before we can take what the Bible says and apply it to our lives, we have to get some things straight. The majority of Christians believe that there are parts of the Bible that aren't God's perfect word. Believe it or not, there are people out there who mistakenly think that what **you** think about the Bible is just as good as what I think about the Bible.

Contrary to this common misunderstanding, it doesn't matter what we believe about the Bible. What does matter is what God says about it. Once you get into who believes what about the Bible, the authority becomes your opinion, your ego, rather than God's Word. The Bible uses some very powerful language in discussing the authority of scripture and people changing what it says. 1 Timothy 1:3-5 says, "...instruct certain men not to teach strange doctrines, nor to pay attention to myths and endless genealogies, which give rise to mere speculation rather than furthering the administration of God which is by faith. But the goal of our instruction is love from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith." The objective of teaching the Bible is "love from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith." When people deny God's authority in the Bible, they deny Jesus, as Jude 1:4 says. ("For certain persons have crept in unnoticed, those who were long beforehand marked out for this condemnation, ungodly persons who turn the grace of our God into licentiousness and deny our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ.")

Many people, in accordance with this common belief that my thoughts on the Bible are just as good as yours feel that the only thing people need to believe is the "basics" of Jesus. What, though, are the "basics" of Jesus if my beliefs of Jesus are different from yours? If you just go back to the "basics" and say Christianity is all about the "basics" of Jesus, without considering more intricate

aspects of His life that the Bible clearly teaches, Jesus could mean many different things.

Many consider Him no more than a prophet. Could a prophet save people from their sins? No. Others consider Him only divine but not human. How, then, did He live a life of perfection overcoming sin? (1 Timothy 1:17 - "Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.") The only solution that works is if Jesus if fully God and fully man. (John 20:30-31 - "Therefore many other signs Jesus also performed in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these have been written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name.") We can't comprehend this mystery of Jesus but that's what the Bible says, so we must take it in faith.

The reason theology is important is because it gives a basis of beliefs. Rather than saying "I believe in Jesus," using the word "Jesus" to refer to whatever you want, the Bible qualifies Jesus, it describes Jesus as the fully God, fully man, Son of God.

John 20:30-31 (quoted earlier in this article) explains why the miracles of Jesus were recorded - so we "may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name." We don't have the Bible so we can debate it. It exists as one method by which God communicates His wonderful plan of grace through Jesus.

Too Old for 2002 - NOT!!!!!

Another misconception about the Bible is the thought, "It's too old to apply to today." The opposite is actually quite true - the Bible applies to 2002 no less, if not more, than it did 2000 years ago. Read the descriptions of the "immoral" in the Bible. Those people were doing the same stuff that people do today.

We read in Galatians 5:19-21, "Now the deeds of the flesh are evident, which are: immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, disputes, dissensions, factions, envying, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these, of which I forewarn you, just as I have forewarned you, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God."

People today are still sinners - that hasn't changed. People still need Jesus today. People frequently excuse the Bible's importance today saying that it's too old. Well, over 2000 years ago, the Greeks came up with the Democratic system of government. Surprise, surprise...we use that **today!** ...What do you know...that's one of the best systems, if not the best, system of government around!

Just because something is old, it doesn't mean it's too old to for today. If that were the case, then why would I go visit grandma all the time? Her cookies are great and she also has a lot of helpful advice. *Especially with the girls!*

Devotional—What does it mean to be perfect?

In math class we learn a lot of stuff, and often we ask, "How do I use this?" We ask this question with more than just Math class, though; we ask this question in almost everything we do. When we learn things, we can't just learn the rules, we need to learn how to use them.

Many of you open your Bibles and read them. Well, that's great, but do you apply what you read? If Jesus says "Do not take an oath at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God." (Matthew 5:34) Does that mean you swear to people taking oaths and promising things other than Christ Jesus? The Bible, contrary to the beliefs of many believers as well as non-believers, is **not** just a collection of stories and myths that are pleasurable reading. **The Bible is a guide to life.**

People often complain that the Bible is too complicated to apply to their lives. I think that people just don't want to bother to take the time out to *try* applying the Bible to their lives. It is much easier to go to school every day, swear, talk about sex, and, after the bells rings smoke weed, than it is to say "no" and go in peace to have fellowship with your Brethren.

Christ never said following Him would be easy. *Luke 12:53* talks about division and persecution in families - between you and your brother, sister, and mother. In *Matthew 7:13*, Christ says it is a narrow door to him; it's not easy.

Just because the life isn't easy, though, doesn't mean we give up, cheap out, and live like the rest of the world. John 15:18 reminds us that we are to be in this world, not of it. Sometimes that is very hard to do because we are frequently tempted to sin and, in many situations, it seems rewarding to do what everyone else is doing. Let me tell you a secret, though, there is a much better reward for those who turn away from sin: Jesus.

Next time you go and read your <u>Bible</u>, think about *the ways that you can apply what you are reading*, don't just shrug it off. Use it every day of you life, and **apply it just like Jesus did**. (Mark 1:13 NASB - "He was in the wilderness forty days being tempted by Satan; and He was with the wild beasts, and the angels were ministering to Him.")

Face it, we live in Sodom and Gomorrah. It's great to know that with Jesus we have a chance at resisting temptation.
