Introduction: of all the things that are of significant value in our lives, prayer should be cherished the most. However, my brothers and my sisters, I have discovered that for many of us prayer is often relegated to the bottom of our priority list. We live in an age where Christians will spend more time in gossip than we do in prayer. We spend more time on the internet than we do in prayer. We spend more time landscaping our money than we do in landscaping our prayer life. We invest more time polishing our cars than we do polishing our prayer life. But I must remind you today, that all of these tangible items cannot sustain you in the midst of tribulation. Physical possessions are temporal and can vanish in the twinkling of an eye. But prayer provides spiritual maintenance for the upkeep of our souls. So if there is anything of value in this world it is the significance of prayer. (Dr. Phillip

Paschal, The Significance Of Prayer: Luke 18:1)

Dr. Paschal brings up a very important point, one which has already been mentioned. It's easy to slip and let physical things replace our prayer life. If the 3.3 million independent business owners of Amway Corporation devoted half their time spent selling products to praying instead, what do you think would happen to Amway's success percentage? Spirituality is a key, but spirituality with Christ is a necessity. I saw a bumper sticker on the road a couple of days ago that said, "Returning the values back to America." I wondered if that driver had been praying recently.

After September 11th, people felt helpless. Their dreams of success weren't working out, so they turned to prayer. Now that things have calmed down and much order has restored, we've drifted away from prayer again. When will we return?

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What is True Success?

Devotional—Succeeding through Christ

Now there was a rich man, and he habitually dressed in purple and fine linen, joyously living in splendor every day. And a poor man named Lazarus was laid at his gate, covered with sores, and longing to be fed with the crumbs which were falling from the rich man's table; besides, even the dogs were coming and licking his sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away by the angels to Abraham's bosom; and the rich man also died and was buried. In Hades he lifted up his eyes, being in torment, and saw Abraham far away and Lazarus in his bosom. And he cried out and said, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus so that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool off my tongue, for I am in agony in this flame.' Luke 16:19-31

There are few people alive today who don't care how successful they are in life, as measured by worldly standards. Most people in the United States, if not in the entire world, feel that, to make their lives worthwhile, they must be happy. They attempt to obtain this happiness by a variety of methods. Some try to earn lots of money so they can buy big houses, drive expensive cars, and wear elegant clothing. Others believe that they will be happy if they raise a nice family and have a modest income. Yet others feel that they will be happy if their children are better off - if they attend college and find a good job - than they were. All of these things, though, last only for the duration of life, and they don't necessarily bring the happiness many people think they do.

All of these things - money, nice houses, cars, clothing, a good education, and so forth - are nice to have. None of these things in and of themselves are wrong to have. The problem comes when people place their trust in these things and depend on them, when people make these things their goal in life. Each of these things may bring false happiness and enjoyment, but that pleasure never lasts past the end of one's life, nor is it *truly* satisfying. When we die we leave everything here behind and face God's judgment. Our actions, how much we have made, and the worldly possessions we have stored up on earth can't help us. If these are the things in which we place our hope and trust while here on earth, then that's all we'll ever get for all of eternity. On the other hand, trusting in Jesus will help us when we face judgment. If we place our hope and trust in Jesus Christ, we will receive the wonderful eternal blessings and true happiness found only with Him.

Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal

Matthew 6:19-20

What makes a person truly successful? Many people place their trust in wealth, but someone truly successful will place his trust in God. Not only then does he receive true happiness after death, but he can also feel secure in Jesus' arms while still here on Earth. He can live for God daily and continually receive the blessings He bestows only on those who obey Him.

Look at many wealthy people today - those who place their trust in their riches are often very unhappy deep down inside, though they don't admit it. In comparison, look at those who come close to dying and/or are persecuted because of their faith in Jesus Christ - some of the happiest people in the world. These people have seen God's love, power, might and strength in times of trouble. They know what it feels like to be truly happy and content not just on the outside but also deep down inside. We, too, can experience true joy by trusting in Jesus.

Now tell me who's truly successful - the man who dies rich but proud and dependent on his money, thinking he has no need for Jesus in his life. Or, the man who dies poor but humble and dependent on Jesus, living the Christ-like life the Bible commands us to live, trusting in Jesus for all his needs?

O Lord, <u>save</u> us; O Lord, grant us <u>success</u>. - Psalm 118:25

Wouldn't it be nice if we succeeded in everything that we did? Wouldn't it be great if every time we strove for something in our lives we obtained it?

Paul envisions people on a track, running the 400 Meter Dash, striving to reach the end. Each and every person gives it all they've got to reach the end. Why, though? Why is it so important to do your best, to reach the end? At the end is a prize, one that matters so much to the runner that it's worth giving everything up to reach it. A runner endures so much pain and physical discomfort in training for one race. The runner may throw out a knee, trip, hurt their foot, or experience any other sort of injury, but it is all worth it because it is a part of completing the race.

I have a friend that tried so hard for a hurdles race that on his way over a hurdle he missed. He chipped his hip, busted up his shoulder, and did a bunch of other damage that, generally speaking, didn't sound very appealing. Why, though? Why was he willing to take the risk of something like that happening? It was so that he could reach the end of those hurdles in a race, and win a prize. The prize might have been his name in the school announcements, or it could have possibly been a medal to wear around his neck. Regardless of what the prize was, he wanted it.

That urge, that power, that will for a goal is what every Christian needs in their daily lives.

Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize.

- 1st Corinthians 9:24

Christians are faced with daily struggle, and daily martyrdom. Every day Christians suffer for what they believe in, and for what they know to be true. Is this success though? Is this what we signed up for? Is this what the Jesus thing is all about?

Let's look at the Apostle Peter's words: "Even if I have to **die** with You, I will not deny You." (Matthew 26:35) (Also read 1 Peter)

Now you may be saying... but he was an apostle, this is was what he signed up for though, right? St. Peter signed up for the exact same thing that you and I did! Jesus Christ died for us; the least we could do is die for Him... right?
